Mongeon, a Licensed Professional Engineer, has 30 years of experience in the energy industry and has managed change for corporations including GE, Honeywell and United Technologies. Kedersha brings a strong financial background to the Board with 25 years of experience as a senior executive at BNY Mellon, an investment and financial services firm.

In addition, two incumbent members were re-elected to the Board of Directors – Joseph Kwasnik of Jackson and Georgie Thomas of Intervale. Following the NHEC Annual Meeting on June 14, Kwasnik was voted Board Chair. He will be succeeding Earl Hansen of Holderness, who retired from the Board after 14 years as Chair.

ANNUAL MEETING 2016



Approximately 200 members and guests turned out June 14 in Plymouth at the 77th Annual Meeting of Members. In his remarks, NHEC President/CEO Steve Camerino invited all members to be part of a companywide strategic planning effort that will chart a path forward for NHEC in a rapidly changing industry. The Co-op will explore new ways to create value for members, Camerino said, but it will seek foremost to continue providing what he called “the three R’s”: Reliability, Responsiveness and Reasonable Rates.

EAP PROVIDES SOLUTIONS FOR MEMBERS IN NEED

The New Hampshire Electric Assistance Program, or EAP, can help income eligible Co-op members pay their electric bills. The EAP provides eligible members with a discount on their monthly electric bills. The discounts range from 8% to 76%, depending on the member's gross household income and household size.

All electric utility customers support the statewide EAP through the system benefits charge portion of their electric bill. The EAP discount helps make bills more affordable and helps customers avoid the risk of having their electric service shut off for non-payment. To be eligible for the program customers must receive an electric bill from a regulated electric utility and have a gross household income that qualifies at the time of application.


