The Town of Rumney has selected NH Broadband as its official Internet provider.



Nothing wrecks your day like an unexpectedly high bill. Next time your electric bill is more than you were expecting, here are a few questions to ask that may get to the bottom of it.

How many days are in the billing cycle?

The number of days in your monthly billing cycle varies from month to month. Sometimes it's as many as 34 days, while other months it's as few as 28. You can see the number of days in each billing cycle at the top right of your bill every month.

NHEC Foundation Awards \$51,000 in Grants


